THE DETROIT ENVIRONMENTAL AGENDA LAUNCHES 2021 MUNICIPAL PRIMARY VOTER GUIDE

The Guide seeks to help Detroiters make informed decisions at polls

[Detroit, MI, June 22] The Detroit Environmental Agenda (DEA) held a press conference this morning at 10a.m. to announce the upcoming release of its 2021 Municipal Voter Guide. The DEA is a Detroit-based coalition of organizations, researchers, and businesses, founded in 2011, to advance environmental justice and sustainability in the City of Detroit. The purpose of the Voter Guide is to inform Detroiters voting in the upcoming primary election about candidates' environmental priorities. In the guide, candidates responded to questions regarding sustainable community development, zoning & air quality, water affordability & infrastructure, energy, transportation, recycling, composting, climate resilience & equity, green jobs, and housing. According to Laprisha Daniels, Executive Director at Detroiters Working for Environmental Justice, the DEA's goal is "to make sure that voters can make informed decisions when they go to the polls." The DEA has been producing voter guides since 2013.

Daniels emphasized the importance of communicating candidates' stances on environmental issues, noting that Detroit is home to 5 of the top 25 most polluted zip codes in Michigan, including zip code 48217 at number 1. Raquel Garcia, Executive Director for Southwest Detroit Environmental Vision, stated, "We are excited to get this critical information into the hands of Detroiters for the Primary Election in August. We know that Detroiters are eager to exercise their voices through their votes. After the pandemic, they have questions about the people that will have the power to directly affect their families and their neighborhoods."
